This week in class		
Nursery	Nursery have had a great week exploring minibeasts. We started the week reading 'The very hungry caterpillar'. The children have created a new classroom display inspired by the book. Ask your child to tell you about the life cycle of a butterfly! On Wednesday we went on our school trip to Camley street nature park. We explored the woodland and found worms, slugs and spiders on our minibeast hunt. We also went pond dipping and were amazed by all the tiny minibeasts in the pond. Nursery were so sensible on our trip, they made us very proud. We were also lucky enough to see some tadpoles, this inspired us to look at the life cycle of a frog. Nursery have learnt makaton signs for minibeasts such as,	
Recep- tion	Reception have been continuing learning the numbers over 10 this week. We covered 13-18. We discovered that some numbers have doubles within them (double 7, double 8 and double 9). In phonics we have been doing CVCC and CCVC words (e.g. pond, punch, frog and smash). We liked playing with frogs and playing subraction smash with the playdough. Our new tricky words were come, some and like. The children were good at writing sentences about what they liked. In Circle time we discussed how our families are all different. We discovered that some of us have big families, some small, some parents work at home, some go to an office etc. It was interesting to learn how different and varied we are!	
Class 1	This week in literacy we have started looking at the story 'Katie in London'. We have discussed all of the different land-marks that she visited and used some adjectives to describe them. In maths we have learned how to count in 2s by learning a song and recognising that all of the numbers are even. In science we have looked at identifying and labelling plants. In PSHE we have learnt how to dial 999 in case of an emergency and have also discussed feelings and being good friends to one another. Well done for a great week Year 1!	
Class 2	We've been so focused and resilient in Class 2 this week! The children have made me so proud with their calm, sensible approach to our upcoming SATS (week beginning 15th May) They have handed in their homework promptly, listened and asked brilliant questions. Beside some SATS revision work, we have continued to learn about fractions. This week, we divided shapes into halves, quarters and thirds. The children now understand that this means 'divided by.' They have used this learning to find out that, if 1/4 of an amount is 2, I would have to multiply this number by 4 to understand how many I have in total. In History, we have added to our information reports by researching Stone Age weapons, hunting, cooking and gathering methods. We have been carefully observing our broad bean seeds and have noticed some exciting developments in our quest to grow them hydroponically! Please continue to count in 2s, 3s, 4s,5s and 10s at home:)	
Class 3	This week Class 3 have been describing some of the main characters of the legend of Beowulf by using expanded noun phrases and up-levelling them to improve them into descriptive sentences, finally on Friday the class will be retelling the story using lots of interesting and descriptive language. In Maths, we have been continuing our learning of fractions and working out fractions of set objects using the method of division of the denominator and multiplication of the numerator. In Science, we dissected a plant into parts and explained their function, we also prepared writing our absorption of water investigation to explain whether we think the food colouring will get absorbed by the plants.	
Class 4	This week Year 4 have been continuing their work on decimals. We have been learning to represent tenths on a number line and a place value grid. In Literacy, we have continued our studies on free verse poetry. We started by writing one using a writing frame. Then later on in the week after some planning, we wrote our own free verse poems about the journey of a longboat. We made sure to include powerful, poetic vocabulary, similes, alliteration, onomatopoeia, repetition and personification. In Art, we have designed and sketched our own Viking longboat figureheads. We then painted them using watercolours. We look forward to sharing these with you in our class assembly on Friday!	
Class 5	This week, Class 5 has learned in Maths how to measure angles using a protractor; draw lines and angles accurately; calculate angles around a point and on a straight line; and calculate lengths and calculate lengths and angles in different shapes. In English, we continued reading and analysing 'The Arrival - answering reading comprehension questions and analysing the emotional impact illustrations can have on a reader. In PHSE, we had another lovely session of iheart where we talked about the impact labels from others can have on our thoughts and behaviour. In RE, Class 5 discussed different Rites of Passage; in Geography we looked at different locations in the Americas, comparing their characteristics, and in Science we looked at different forces, such as gravity, air resistance, water resistance and friction.	
Class 6	Another week of great revision and filling those gaps in knowledge by all the year 6 children. We also commenced our topic on Resilience by examining different kinds of relationship and what happens when we show little resilience with our close friends and other friendships. In maths, we reviewed coordinates in 4 quadrants, percentages, 2d/3d shape and their properties, measurement, lines and angles. In Literacy - using the skills of persuasive writing from before Easter - the children penned a persuasive letter to Rob about the benefits of NOT introducing a school uniform to Fitzjohn's. We also began our Isle of Wight topic with some deduction and inference exercises as well as examining how to use 6 figure grid references to locate places on a map.

You or your child must receive one of the following to apply for free school meals:

- Income Support
- · Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- · Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including benefits)
- · Child Tax Credit with a taxable income of no more than £16,190 and not in receipt of Working Tax Credit
- the Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- support from the National Asylum Support Service (NASS)

If you receive Working Tax Credit you will not be entitled to free school meals unless you have:

- stopped work in the last 4 weeks; or
- reduced your hours to less than 16 hours in the last 4 weeks
