This week in class		
Nursery	This week we've continued with an art focus. We read 'The dot' which inspired us to create 2d and 3d forms of dot art. We've recently focused on the primary colours; red, yellow and blue. We used the primary colours to carry out an art experiment. We decorated coffee filter paper with primary colours and then used a water spray to wet the paper. Nursery closely observed changes, noticing new colours forming. It was very exciting! We continued exploring colour mixing with Catherine, using our gross motor skills to create large dots on paper outside. We've also been busy taking care of our Nursery garden, watering the plants and flowers on a daily basis. We're so proud of how much they've grown. Have a wonderful half term.	
Reception	Reception have been reading Little Red Riding Hood this week. We have been ordering and retelling the story. As we are now cake experts, we wanted to make cupcakes again so we wrote our shopping lists and headed off to Tesco to get the ingredients. This time we attempted chocolate cupcakes. This week in phonics we have been recapping all our digraphs and trigraphs by using them in writing longer words. We are also getting fantastic at reading and writing our tricky words. Our new tricky words this week were 'one', 'out' and 'today'. In maths we have been continuing to take away . We read the book Shopping Basket by John Burningham. We loved the animals taking away different items, and thought of our own take away stories. We could also act out the story in our own supermarket role play.	
Class 1	This week in literacy we have written an information text all about A.A. Milne. The children first corrected mistakes in the text and then wrote the text out again in their best handwriting. In maths we have continued our work on arrays and have also worked on the concepts of making equal groups by sharing and grouping. In science the children have added to their sunflower diaries. In art we have started making prints of certain London landmarks using Styrofoam. Today the children made us all extremely proud during their class assembly. Every child memorised their lines and said them clearly and confidently. We ended this busy week with our end of topic picnic and treasure hunt. We read books, played music, played games and ate some lovely food that the children had prepared themselves. Well done Class 1 and wish you a lovely break!	
Class 2	This week in Class 2, we have been tackling time in maths, with varying degrees of success! We have realised that there are many layers to being able to tell the time: fractions, the five times table, division and subtraction! Please continue to help your child to read the time on analogue clocks over the half term holiday. In literacy, we have been writing diaries. Class 2 included facts and feelings in their diary entry about a little girl who finds she is an integral part of the clock tower in her villageOn Friday, we went to the Hampstead Heath Education Centre to study plants. We enjoyed a lovely picnic and are now ready for a well-earned break. Enjoy your half term!	
Class 3	This week in Class Three was all about orange, the children all dressed up in orange clothing, orange hair and face paint and brought in a 1 pound donation. On Tuesday afternoon the children were super excited to be able to design and make their very own board game in groups of three (knowing that a prize was in store for the best one). Also this week in Literacy we wrote a diary entry about a typical day as a farmer during the Anglo-Saxon age. In Maths we continued looking at time, duration of the start and end of an activity using a number line and how to read a digital and analogue clock. Finally in Computing we put our Geography skills to the test by using Busy Things and in Art we made Anglo-Saxon brooches using foil and gems. Have a fantastic Half Term everyone!	
Class 4	This week Year 4 have continued to enjoy their Vikings learning. We have worked hard to create impressive long-boats, which will be sent home today with a sail if you wish to add it. In Literacy, we have been carefully writing up our Viking sagas for our class book. We have also created bold and bright front covers to go with them. In Maths, we have continued our learning on decimals. We can now order compare and flexibly partition decimals. On Tuesday, we had a super day at the CLC. We used all of our knowledge on the Vikings to create informative, interactive eBooks. We learnt how to include images, videos and links in these. Well done Year 4! Have a lovely half term holiday but don't forget to practice those times tables!	
Class 5	This week, Class 5 learned in Maths how to add and subtract decimals with different decimal places; how to use efficient strategies to ad and subtract decimals mentally; decimals sequences as well as multiplying decimals by 10, 100 and 1000. In English, we finished reading the graphic novel The Invention of Hugo Cabret, analysing the last chapters and learning how to blend action and description when writing. In Geography, Class 5 learned about the 7 Wonders of the Ancient and Modern World. Lastly, we had lots of fun in Science, conducting our boat race experiment.	
Class 6	After our amazing trip to the Isle of Wight, class 6 have worked diligently on the projects - which are due on the 16th June. Rob was also present in class 6 to start the process of casting parts for the year 6 production. We also continued our maths topic of lines and angles by looking at adjacent, unknown angles around a point and on a straight line. In Literacy, the children completed a piece of extended writing based on our short movie called 'The Other Pair'. Dawn's Art lesson was all about celebrating 75 years of the NHS - as the children are competing in a local Art competition. We also refocused our minds on the concept of 'unhealthy relationships' - discussing what can go wrong and how we can make things better in a range of social situations.

Please check if you are entitled to Free School Meals (Nursery to Y6). Please send me the confirmation email if you are entitled:

You or your child must receive one of the following to apply for free school meals:

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including benefits)
- Child Tax Credit with a taxable income of no more than £16,190 and not in receipt of Working Tax Credit
- the Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- support from the National Asylum Support Service (NASS)

If you receive Working Tax Credit you will not be entitled to free school meals unless you have:

- stopped work in the last 4 weeks; or
- reduced your hours to less than 16 hours in the last 4 weeks
