	This week in class
Nursery	Nee naw nee naw can you guess what we've been learning about this week? That's right, firefighters! We started our 'People who help us topic' with a trip to the Kentish Town fire station. We met a firefighter called Scott, who talked to us about his role as a firefighter, as well as fire safety. We were lucky enough to sit in a fire engine and try on a helmet. We even made Jenna wear a firefighter's uniform! At the beginning of the week, Nursery helped make a fire engine. We've been very busy putting out fires all week. Next week we'll be learning about the role of a doctor.
Reception	Reception's topic this term is 'Growing', so we have spent the week attempting to grow some plants. We grew cress, carrots and some wild flowers. I wonder which will sprout first? We did some lovely flower paintings this week. We used watercolours to add detail to the petals and to show the different aspects plants need to grow. In phonics we have been reading and writing CVCC and CCVC words with long vowels in. We are getting excellent at creating and writing sentences including the new words. In maths we learnt what doubling is (when we have two of the same). We loved watching the doubles rap song and exploring different ways to show double facts up to 10.
Class 1	This week in literacy the children have planned and written some lovely poems about summer. They used some lovely adjectives in their work and have presented their writing beautifully. In maths we have started looking at fractions. The children have learnt all about halving shapes and objects and ensuring that the two parts are equal. In science we have been comparing different types of plants and adding to our sunflower plant diaries. The sunflowers will be judged at the end of next week and the winner will receive a small prize. As our new topic is 'Going Green', we have discussed various ways that we can help look after our school environment. We have created posters that will be displayed around the school at a later date and have started planning for our end of topic movie. Well done for a great first week back Year 1!
Class 2	This week in Class 2, we have created Stone Age-inspired clothing using our finest sewing skills. The children designed, cut, sewed and embellished their outfits and are looking forward to showing you their creations during Assembly next week. In literacy, we have been writing the build-up of our story about a mysterious black hat. The children have been putting all the knowledge and skills that they have picked up this year into practise, with some beautiful descriptions as a result. Many thanks if you have volunteered to help on our trip to Keats Library next Tuesday. Don't forget to bring books back by Monday at the latest please.
Class 3	This week in Class 3, we began with our new Maths unit of properties of shape, we started with exploring turns and angles and practiced this by moving around the classroom with a given instruction and also looked for different types of angles around class three. In Literacy, we have been exploring the features of poetry, such as aliteration, rhyming and repetition. We have read and performed various types of poem ready for starting our new book, 'the Lost Words', we have been writing a draft including metaphors, similes and alliteration. We also had a fantastic sports day on Thursday and all the children worked well as a team and gave every activity their best shot. Finally, in Science we continued looking at plants and made a poster to consolidate our learning about what we have learnt about plants and remembering to use lots of Scientific vocabulary.
Class 4	Year 4 have had a great first week back after the half term break. Our topic for this half term is the Rainforest! As part of our Literacy learning, we have been researching different aspects of the Amazon. We will be using our findings to create non-fiction information texts. In Maths, we are using our decimal knowledge to deepen our understand of money. We are able to convert between pounds and pence as well as order and compare amounts. Year 4 did amazingly well in Sports Day on Thursday. In the sunshine, they demonstrated excellent team work, resilience and respect for their fellow competitors. Well done Year 4!
Class 5	This week, Class 5 has learned in Maths how to multiply and divide decimals as well as understand negative numbers and count through zero in 1s. In English, we started reading the narrative poem The Highwayman by Alfred Noyes, analysing the literary techniques used by the poet. We also wrote our own diary entries through the point of view of one of the characters in the poem and learned about modal verbs. In Geography, we went through how to use atlases to locate cities and physical geographical features in Europe, while in Science we learned about the human life cycle. We also had loads of fun rehearsing for our Assembly!
Class 6	A great week in the pool with lots of children showing great resilience learning new skills and techniques. Rehearsals for the play have been gathering pace with large parts of the performance now 'blocked' (children know where to stand and their entrances/exits) and a few songs rehearsed. In DT, the children learned how to complete a 'cross-stitch' with some really impressive designs on their fabric. FYI: Next Friday (16th June), is the deadline day for our Isle of Wight projects.

Applying for Free School Meals

Please check if you are entitled to Free School Meals (Nursery to Y6). Please send me the confirmation email if you are entitled:

You or your child must receive one of the following to apply for free school meals:

- · Income Support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- · Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including benefits)
- Child Tax Credit with a taxable income of no more than £16,190 and not in receipt of Working Tax Credit
- the Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- support from the National Asylum Support Service (NASS)

If you receive Working Tax Credit you will not be entitled to free school meals unless you have:

- stopped work in the last 4 weeks; or
- reduced your hours to less than 16 hours in the last 4 weeks
