This week in class Nurserv This week we've been learning about 'Doctors'. The children have been learning about the role of a doctor, as well as a nurse and paramedic. We're looking forward to Keiko, a nurse (Himari's mum) and Evelyn, a doctor (Vaia's mum) talking to us about their jobs next week. The children have thoroughly enjoyed the doctor role play in class, we've had a lot of broken arms and legs! It's been a very hot week, so we decided there was only one thing we could do..... have a pool day! We had great fun in the pool and we also made lemonade. The children used their gross and fine motor strength to squeeze the lemons and it was delicious, so refreshing on a hot day. We've also started learning new songs for our assembly, we can't wait for you to see our final assembly. Next week our focus will be on 'Postal workers'. We also have sports day to look forward to. Recep-Reception's cress had grown quickly over the weekend, so we decided to have it in sandwiches. We headed to Tesco to tion buy ingredients, made the sandwiches and enjoyed a picnic outside. We also had grapes which the children evenly shared between themselves (our maths theme for this week). We also got a special delivery of some caterpillars this week. They were small but already are growing. It has been nice to compare them with the different caterpillars Livya and Cris brought in. In phonics we have been reading and writing CCCVC, CCVC, and CCV words. Finally on Thursday we had a great time splashing in the paddling pool, it brought some much needed coolness. Class 1 This week in Class 1 in Maths we were finding halves and quarters of different shapes. Computing with Gillian from the CLC on Thursday we were coding how to create their own characters in our games. We also all did our phonics screening check and were super brilliant and resilient! Class 2 This week in Class 2, we have finished writing our magical stories about 'The Black Hat.' The children have used interesting verbs and expanded noun phrases to describe how the boy in the story was feeling. We introduced a new game of 'maths bingo' and the children have the opportunity to have their names added to the winners' board every day. We have been playing using our 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 time tables, so make sure you keep practising these! We have spent time practising our assembly this week and will be starting a new module on statistics in maths on Monday. I have managed to book a Circus skills workshop at Primrose Hill Community Centre on Wednesday 5th July from 12.45-2. We will be walking there from school (leaving at 10.15 and eating an early lunch on Primrose Hill beforehand) The children have been asking whether they could do this session, as they missed out on it in Reception due to Covid restrictions. Class 3 This week in Class 3, we have spending our second week looking at shape and we learned the difference between horizontal, diagonal and vertical lines and types of angles, we tackled lots of word problems with all of the knowledge that we have acquired over the last few weeks. In Literacy, we have been going into more depth with our poetry unit exploring many of the spells from the book of 'the Lost Words', in fact we searched through the book for some great examples of acrostic poems and created our own versions using powerful adjectives, verbs and created a number of sentences using similes. In Geography, we started our last unit of the year using map skills, recognising map symbols and compass directions. Class 4 Year 4 have been busy authors this week. After extensive planning, we have started our non-fiction information text projects on the Amazon Rainforest. We have carefully designed our front covers and written our contents pages and introductions. We are ensuring that we are including all of the necessary features, including: a title, subheadings, technical language, present tense and third person. In Maths, we are learning to add and subtract different amounts of money, using a number line, the column method or mental strategies. In Art, we have drawn a wide range of animals and plants from the rainforest using oil pastels and chalk. In Geography, we have located the different tropical rainforests around the world. We realised that they were all in the Tropics, between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn. Class 5 This week, Class 5 finished with the topic of Negative Numbers in Maths, learning to count through zero in multiples, compare and order negative numbers as well as find the difference between positive and negative numbers. In English, we finished reading The Highwayman, where we continued analysing the last few stanzas of the narrative poem. We also wrote our own ending to the poem and wrote an internal monologue from a character's point of view. In PSHE, we spoke about changes as we've grown from babies to children, making a timeline of our most important events in life. In Science, Class 5 learned to make bar and line graphs to present data on the growth of babies in height. In RE, we discussed the difference between routine and ritual, making instruction booklets on the use of the rosary in Christianity. Class 5 also had an amazing time visiting London Central Mosque and then having lunch at Regent's Park! Class 6 Another week in the pool: children in class 6 are doing brilliantly and really progressing with their stroke skills and technique in the water. In the class 6 'Our Business' topic, we created our 'companies' and the children are in the process of

communicating their company vision by choosing their business name, logo, slogan and designing all elements of their identity. Rehearsals for the play have again been purposeful and scenes are beginning to take shape. Please note: I am away on jury service - possibly for two weeks - as of Monday 19th. Lessons and life in school will continue as normal for

year 6 however with Dawn and Rob covering in class.

As the resignation date has now passed, I am in the position to tell you who will be taking each class. Obviously this is subject to change but we are not envisaging any alterations.

The resignation date for Teaching Assistants is much later so we will let you know about them as soon as we can.

Jason Kennedy will be leaving us as his fixed term contract has come to an end. We will say our proper goodbyes at the end of term.

Applying for Free School Meals

Please check if you are entitled to Free School Meals (Nursery to Y6). Please send me the confirmation email if you are entitled:

You or your child must receive one of the following to apply for free school meals:

- Income Support
- · Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- · Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including benefits)
- · Child Tax Credit with a taxable income of no more than £16,190 and not in receipt of Working Tax Credit
- the Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- support from the National Asylum Support Service (NASS)

If you receive Working Tax Credit you will not be entitled to free school meals unless you have:

- stopped work in the last 4 weeks; or
- reduced your hours to less than 16 hours in the last 4 weeks
