

Please send me the confirmation email if you are entitled: You or your child must receive one of the following to apply for free school meals: Income Support Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance Income-related Employment and Support Allowance Universal Credit – your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including benefits) Child Tax Credit with a taxable income of no more than £16,190 and not in receipt of Working Tax Credit the Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit support from the National Asylum Support Service (NASS) If you receive Working Tax Credit you will not be entitled to free school meals unless you have: stopped work in the last 4 weeks; or reduced your hours to less than 16 hours in the last 4 weeks Applications must be made in the name of the person who is receiving the benefit. https://

	This week in class			
Nursery	Nursery have had a very exciting week. On Tuesday PC Charlotte came to visit. She spoke to us about her role as a police officer, as well as keeping safe in the community. She also brought along 3 police officers and a police minibus! We were lucky enough to sit in the minibus and PC Charlotte turned on the siren and lights. We write our name every morning and we've become such super stars with our name writing. On Wednesday we found a fully grown courgette in the garden, so we decided to make spaghetti with the courgette and kale from our school garden. It was delicious! We've had a few visits to Reception class this week, Nursery have enjoyed getting to know Emma and Danielle. We had a great time during our transition morning on Friday. Nursery are ready for their next chapter in Reception class.			
Reception	Reception had such a fun trip to Pizza Express on Tuesday. We all learnt how to make a pizza, and then got to eat it back at school. Such a treat! It inspired us to look at maps in our Maths this week. We explored all different types of maps, and then we drew maps of our journey to Pizza Express. We also drew maps of obstacle courses we wanted to set up outside. Iy has been fun trying each others out. In phonics we have been looking at words ending in -er and -est, before reviewing all the words from the year. We all did super well in writing our final sentence of the year in our books! Finally, this week we had fun being creative in thinking what we would what to be 'when we grow up'. We took inspiration from the Matilda song we are learning for our Graduation.			
Class 1	This week in literacy we have done some writing based around the story 'Michael Recycle'. In maths we have focused on the concept of money. We have looked at coin and note recognition and counting money. In topic we have been creating our movie 'Going Green'. The children have recalled various facts and have done some amazing acting, singing and dancing. In art the children created some brilliant Beano artwork with our visiting artist Nigel Parkinson. Well done for another fantastic week Year 1!			
Class 2	This week in Class 2, we started the week with a really fun session led by Nigel Parkinson from the Beano. He led a draw-along and the results were fantastic! Everyone enjoyed drawing Dennis, Gnasher, Minnie the Minx, Roger the Dodger and Rasher. In maths this week we have been reviewing part whole models and also counting in 3s. In literacy, the children have been practising and performing new and classic poems and also compiling their own book of poetry.			
Class 3	This week in Class Three, the children were very lucky to have Nigel Parkinson, the illustrator from Beano to come in and show us his wonderful skills in character drawing. The children were taken step by step on how to do their very own versions of the comic characters and to great effect. Also, this week in Literacy, the class have been busy revising all of their writing skills and wrote their very own imaginative story using a simple photo. In Maths, we have have been revising our times tables, as well as types of angles, bar charts, fractions and measurement. The children have surprised themselves with how much learning they can remember.			
Class 4	Year 4 have continued to keep up their brilliant and focus. In Maths, we have finished our learning on shapes and symmetry and have moved on to learn about co-ordinates in our 'Position and Direction' unit. In Literacy, we have each written a letter to our Year 5 teacher, Evangelia, with all of the information we want her to know about us. We have also read a story about the Rainforest, entitled 'The Sharman's Apprentice.' This is inspired by a true story and is about a young boy who aspires to be a sharman, using the plants from the Amazon for medicine. In Science, we have been interpreting and creating classification keys, based on our understanding of the character-istics of different animals groups. In PSHE, we have been learning how to stay safe online and how to resist pressurising behaviour.			
Class 5	This week, Class 5 have been enjoying making our own maths quizzes on Kahoot based on all the learning we've done since the beginning of the year. In English, we wrote persuasive arguments to support different statements and we also did a debate on whether weekends should be three days. In Geography, we learned about the Chernobyl disaster and looked at the effects the incident had on different countries. In PSHE, we discussed how gender is used in advertisements and the effect of this and in Science we learned about the life expectancy of different animals and whether they're correlated to their gestation period.			
Class 6	A busy week of rehearsals and the production is really starting to take shape: rumours have it that after a limited run In Hampstead, it is moving to the West End! In other areas of learning, we are continuing the experiment on parental responsibility through the caring of our flour babies and it is indeed a wonderful sight to behold such caring and nurturing parents. Our business winners are busily preparing their items to sell at the Summer Fair and the rest of the class have been working on their yearbooks and designing their own comics after our wonderful session with Beano artist Nigel Parkinson. One week left!

On Monday Y1-Y6 were visited by the most important living British artist (obviously in Rob's opinion) Nigel Parkinson. Nigel draws Dennis the Menace in Beano. He taught us all how to draw cartons (starting with the nose!). He was kind enough to sign the drawings he used in the demonstrations which we shall be selling at the fair on Saturday.
