| Class 3 | This week in Class 3, we got off to a fantastic start. The children remembered all the class rules and followed them very carefully. We signed a class charter to say we would keep to these rules all year. In maths, we took the opportunity to recap our 2, 5 and 10 times tables before beginning our Place Value topic next week. We reminded ourselves of what a times table actually is by drawing them out using groups, or repeated addition, before writing them out neatly. To kick start our geography topic, we made passports all about ourselves, emphasising and celebrating individuality. This term we have gym on a Wednesday and outdoor games on a Thursday, so please ensure your child is suitably dressed for these lessons. We have also started practicing our times tables to hit the ground running for the Multiplication Table Check! | | | |

Class 5 created All About Me booklets where we described what makes us unique as part of this half term's value: Individuality. In Maths, we looked at the place value of numbers to 10,000, while in Literacy, we spoke about our new topic - Ancient Greece - and we researched information about different mythological creatures, summarising the key facts and then also creating our own mythological creatures. | | | |
