Camden Foodbank, a local registered charity, part of the Trussell Trust group of foodbanks in the UK, is currently experiencing an overwhelming demand of adults and children descending into food poverty. The effect of the pandemic, followed by the cost of living crisis has caused an increasing number of local people to go into food crisis as they have no money for food to eat. When people go into food hunger they are referred by a wide range of local professionals and referral agencies who work closely with Camden Foodbank and who issue people in need with a foodbank voucher. This voucher allows people in food poverty to come to Camden Foodbank to receive a 3-day emergency supply of food.

This week in class					
Nursery					
Recep- tion	Reception have had a great first week! They have quickly got used to new routines and have enjoyed exploring the class-room both inside and outside. Lunchtimes have been successful with children trying new foods and learning the routines in the hall. On Friday we really enjoyed our first music lesson with Ezra, and we were creative with junk modelling. A great start				
Class 1	This week the children have done some amazing work in their phonics. In Year 1 they have phonics book and write a sentence in there each day. I am astounded by their writing already so keep up the good work Year 1. In maths we have focused on sorting and counting objects up to 10. In literacy the children told me a bit about themselves and wrote some key words and then a simple sentence. In science we have learned a bit about the four seasons of the year. In geography we have started learning our continents song. Today we had some great fun learning all about the Jewish celebration of Rosh Hashanah - thank you to all of our lovely visitors. Well done for another great week Year 1.				
Class 2	Class 2 have worked incredibly hard this week and been tremendously resilient. We have covered maths, science, literacy, PSHE, IT, PE, History and RE and touched on at least a couple more. We started the week by showing Kapiti Kiwi some of the sites of our school. We made maps to direct him to the highlights and then used these ideas in a story all about his visit to Fitzjohn's. In maths, we have spent plenty of time consolidating counting in 10s, 5s and 2s. We have also begun to examine 'Place Value' in more detail. Later in the week, we started to explore our 'Eye on London' topic, planning different routes to take us from Fitzjohn's to Parliament Hill Viewpoint, where we will be going to sketch the great London skyline. We talked about various London landmarks, which the children had visited. We have also enjoyed getting to know the children a little better in Guided Reading groups this week. They have contributed with enthusiasm and thoughtfulness and we're looking forward to our reading journeys this year! It was wonderful to see so many of you at the 'Meet the Parents' meeting. Please feel free to catch me outside or email me at j.rich@fitzjohns.camden.sch.uk if you missed the meeting or have a question. I would be happy to fill you in.				
Class 3	This week in Class 3, we have started looking at Place Value in maths. We looked at counting up to 100 in 2s, 5s ad 10s, solving problems and creating number sequences on number lines. We also used part-whole models to partition 2-digit numbers. In literacy, we looked at the features of an informal letter, then planned our own letter to our future selves, making goals for our journey through Year 3. We also looked at conjunctions to extend sentences, and aim to utilise them to extend our sentences in our Big Write. In geography, we talked about and located countries in Europe and so many of us have relatives from all parts of Europe! In Science, we are sorting food into groups and reinforcing healthy eating choices. It was great to meet so many of you at the meeting this week. Thanks for coming!				
Class 4	It's been a busy first full week for Year 4. We have tried hard to follow the Class Charter to ensure we are the best learners we can be. In Maths, we are building on our place value knowledge to include numbers up to 1000. We are able to represent these numbers on a number line, as well as using a part whole model, place value grid, number sentence, place value counters and dienes! In Literacy, we have started our class text "The Adventures of Robin Hood." We have written powerful descriptions of the famous outlaw, using thesauruses to find powerful adjectives. In Science, we have started our States of Matter topic. We learnt the differences between the particles in a solid, liquid and a gas and sorted different items into the correct group.				
Class 5	This week, Class 5 learned in Maths to read and write numbers up to 1,000,000 as well as count up and down in multiples of 10. In English, we read the Ancient Greek myth Daedalus and Icarus; we looked at the main parts of the myth - Introduction, Build up, Climax, Resolution and Ending; as well as planned our own myths and started writing the introduction. In Science, Class 5 discussed the sexual reproduction of plants through pollination and in PSHE we looked at a variety of nutrients that different types of foods provide. In History, we learned who the Ancient Greeks were and how their Empire grew as Alexander The Great conquered more lands and founded cities. Lastly, we drew our own Ancient Greek vases in Art and we also had Games, Gymnastics and Games, as well as parents that came in to talk to us and celebrate Rosh Hashanah.				
Class 6	Manipulating numbers to 10 million including place value charts, part-whole models and understanding power of ten has been the focus in Maths this week. We also had a devilish investigation involving some dastardly frogs: it's freely available online so get your child to talk you through it: https://nrich.maths.org/1246 . In Literacy, we continued looking at poems that use a rich variety of imagery and we focused on using the senses, onomatopoeia and metaphors to plan a poem about the Blitz. In Science, we learned all about fossil creation and in our topic work we compared maps of present day Europe to that of 1939 - tracking the changes in countries and borders.				

Key Stage Assessments 2023

Tests are a snapshot of learning and are obviously dependent on the needs of the class in Year 2/6. They only test some key skills in reading, maths and SPAG; they do not tell you what a kind person you are, how well you've matured, how well you play in a team or act in a play. We also use informal quizzes and tests to help identify gaps in learning. The charts below give you an indication of how our Reception, Y2 and Y6 classes (in 2023) compared to their peers in other schools in Camden and across the country. (Some figures are still provisional) Thank you to all of the staff who played a part in the children's learning. We are all very proud of everyone's learning


Fundraising for the School

Our main focus and the best way to support the school is through monthly donations. Having a steady and predictable source of funding that the school can rely on, means we can safely plan ahead.

Monthly donations accounted for over half our income last year and we now have over 80% of families in the school giving through standing order.

Our aim is that ALL families who are able to will participate as they can. <u>Sign-up here</u> or complete the enclosed form and return to the office.

The other big revenue source (and much more fun) is our events! Our Christmas and Summer Fairs, the Halloween Disco and our popcorn nights are run successfully with support of all our families. It's also a great way to spend time together with friends and create a strong sense of community for our children (and grown-ups) at Fitzjohn's.



How will your donations be used in 2023/2024?

Our goal for the year is to raise £100,000 towards music, art, sport, IT, books and more. When we fund these expenses, that means that the school is able to use its running budget to the fullest on valuable staff and teaching assistants that are a crucial part of our children's learning.

- ✓ Every year the FSA funds the cost of our gym, PE, music, African drumming and art instructors that are not part of the school staff. These activities enrich the curriculum and enable specially trained instructors to teach these subjects. This amounts to £42,000.
- ✓ IT and Digital Skills £15,000 provide computing resources, new/refurbished iPads as well as an annual membership at the CLC (Camden Learning Centre) where the kids go for robotics and coding enrichment activities.
- ✓ Playground equipment Good quality equipment has a real impact on physical and mental wellbeing - £4,000.
- ✓ Learning resources musical instruments, science and geography resources - £20,000.
- √ Transport for trips The FSA funds the coaches and transport costs at £6,000
- ✓ Free clubs for children on Free School Meals – as a community we fund one after-school club per term for every child on FSM, at a total cost of £6,000.
- ✓ Communications and Events £7,000.
