

This week in class		
Nursery	Welcome to Nursery! We've had a few weeks of transition time and now we're all full time. Hooray! The children have adapted to their new environment and they are having a wonderful time playing, as well as making new friendships. We've enjoyed activities such as, playdough, puzzles, dinosaurs, making patterns, riding balance bikes, drawing and water fun! This week we read 'Owl babies'. The story is about a mummy owl leaving her baby owls. Nursery can relate to the story, we know our mummies and daddies will always come at the end of the day! Keep a look out for our 'Owl babies' display in class. We've been talking about our emotions and to help us understand them a little better, we read 'The Colour Monster'. We can now name a range of feelings; angry, happy, calm and worried. We have a feelings Colour Monster display in class to support the children with their emotions each day. We've also enjoyed singing and learning new rhymes.	
Recep- tion	Reception have had a great first full week and done so well. We read the book Super Duper You this week, and it made us think about all the things that we like doing and that make us Super Duper! We drew them all and had a go at writing or copying our names for the front covers of our writing folders. We have also been busy doing art this week, drawing and painting self portraits. We carefully looked at our features to try and get them accurate. In maths we have been meeting the Number-blocks. This week we learnt 1-5. We explored each number and talked about the smaller numbers they are made up of.	
Class 1	This week in phonics Year 1 have been recapping all of their phase 3 graphemes and tricky words. Thank you to all who were able to join on Wednesday - I hope you enjoyed! In literacy we have started reading a new book called Beegu. We have had some lovely discussions about the text and have started writing some labels and captions about the story. In maths we have worked on the concept of 'one more' and 'one less' and counting backwards from 10. During our topic lessons we have continued our work on continents. We have been learning the names of them and how to label them on a world map. We have also started learning some facts about the continent of Asia. In art we have painted some lovely self portraits which are now on display. Well done for another great week Year 1.	
Class 2	In Class 2 this week we were lucky enough to have a visit from Camden Learning Centre, who brought in Blubots and a range of equipment used in programming them. The children wrote algorithms for the Blubots and then tested them. It was brilliant to see the way they problem-solved and visualised in order for the Blubots to get from the start of their 'tracks' to the end without stopping. We discovered a mysterious brown box in the Jungle Area on Monday and have been trying to work out what it contained. In literacy, we wrote stories about what might be inside it, before opening the box to find it was a present for Kapiti Kiwi! In maths, we have been partitioning numbers to 100 using Base 10 equipment. We have also practised writing these numbers the correct way round. We are excited to announce that we will be going on a small walk to the Parliament Hill Viewpoint on Tuesday afternoon to sketch the London skyline. We are hoping it will be sunny, but please send your child to school in a coat and with sensible shoes on, just in case.	
Class 3	This week in Class 3, we continued to study letter-writing skills in literacy. Our new text this week was 'The Day the Crayons Quit.' We read the book together and used our reading skills to infer how each character felt when writing their letter to Duncan. In maths, we continued with place value, using hundreds, tens and ones all the way up to one thousand. We learned to use part-whole models to partition a 3-digit number in different ways. Although this was challenging for some, with resilience we worked together to understand it, using base 10 equipment to help us. In science/PSHE, we used the NHS Eatwell plate to aid us in designing a well-balanced, healthy meal using all the food groups in the right proportions. The most exciting part of the week was hearing all the school council candidates' wonderful persuasive speeches, and holding a very democratic secret ballot to decide on our school council representatives for Class 3. Congratulations to all four of our new school councillors: Romy, Kinan, George and Neva!	
Class 4	Year 4 have been in the dark depths of Sherwood Forest this week as part of our Literacy learning. We have learnt powerful descriptive techniques including alliteration and similes. We have also learnt how to use a thesaurus to find powerful adjectives. In Maths, we have continued our place value learning, by representing 4 digit numbers and learning to partition them in different ways. We are also mastering how to find 1, 10 100 and 1000 more or less than any 4 digit number, which we found tricky. Any extra practice on this at home would be helpful. In PSHE, we created a beautiful display for our value of Individuality. In History, we discussed chronology and events in history using our class timeline. Then, we focused on Ancient Egypt and created a mini timeline of key events during this civilisation.	
Class 5	This week, Class 5 learned in Maths how to count up and down in multiples of 10; how to partition numbers to 1,000,000; to complete number lines as well as compare and order numbers to 1,000,000. In English, we completed writing our own Ancient Greek myths and also wrote our speeches for School Council elections. In PSHE, Class 5 discussed the importance and benefits of staying hydrated and in History we compared the democracy in Ancient Greece with democracy today in the UK. In Science, we looked at the asexual reproduction of plants and compared the benefits to plants' sexual reproduction. Lastly, in RE we looked at different proverbs and their meaning.	
Class 6	Over 3 million children were evacuated at the beginning of WW2 - leaving major cities to head to the relative safety of the countryside. In our topic, we learned about their experiences and used this knowledge to plan and create an 'evacuee letter' to a loved-one back home. We also used our powers of deduction and inference when looking at historical photos of this event. In Maths, we compared, ordered and rounded numbers, concluding with a review of negative numbers. We reviewed the apostrophe for both possession and omission in Literacy and began a new topic focusing on an animation about the war called 'Beyond Enemy Lines' - using drama and role-play to help us with our writing. In PSHE, we reviewed what is means to be healthy in year 6 and we compared fossils in Science, using clay and plaster-of-Paris to create our own fossilized shell remains which we will 'excavate' next week.


Fundraising for the School

Our main focus and the best way to support the school is through monthly donations. Having a steady and predictable source of funding that the school can rely on, means we can safely plan ahead.

Monthly donations accounted for over half our income last year and we now have over 80% of families in the school giving through standing order.

Our aim is that ALL families who are able to will participate as they can. <u>Sign-up here</u> or complete the enclosed form and return to the office.

The other big revenue source (and much more fun) is our events! Our Christmas and Summer Fairs, the Halloween Disco and our popcorn nights are run successfully with support of all our families. It's also a great way to spend time together with friends and create a strong sense of community for our children (and grown-ups) at Fitzjohn's.



How will your donations be used in 2023/2024?

Our goal for the year is to raise £100,000 towards music, art, sport, IT, books and more. When we fund these expenses, that means that the school is able to use its running budget to the fullest on valuable staff and teaching assistants that are a crucial part of our children's learning.

- ✓ Every year the FSA funds the cost of our gym, PE, music, African drumming and art instructors that are not part of the school staff. These activities enrich the curriculum and enable specially trained instructors to teach these subjects. This amounts to £42,000.
- ✓ IT and Digital Skills £15,000 provide computing resources, new/refurbished iPads as well as an annual membership at the CLC (Camden Learning Centre) where the kids go for robotics and coding enrichment activities.
- ✓ Playground equipment Good quality equipment has a real impact on physical and mental wellbeing - £4,000.
- ✓ Learning resources musical instruments, science and geography resources - £20,000.
- √ Transport for trips The FSA funds the coaches and transport costs at £6,000
- ✓ Free clubs for children on Free School Meals – as a community we fund one after-school club per term for every child on FSM, at a total cost of £6,000.
- ✓ Communications and Events £7,000.
