

What WE will do:


Check your child's attendance every day.

This week in class		
Nursery	We're settling in well, as well as learning to share and show kindness to our new friends. This week we read 'Skin like mine' and 'The colour of us'. We looked at our skin tones and talked about how our skin is unique to us and that's what makes us all beautiful. The children have started painting self- portraits, carefully looking at their skin tone, eye colour and hair colour. They'll be on display next week! We've also been making faces with play-dough. We've been singing new rhymes, this week our rhyme is '5 little ducks'. We've also enjoyed singing 5 green bottles, 5 little peas	
Recep- tion	Reception started phonics this week. We learnt the sounds 's', 'a', 't', and 'p'. We have been learning to recognise the graphemes (how they are written), listen out for things that start with those sounds and even have a go at writing the letters. You might have seen our writing all over the playground! For P.E. to help us remember 's' we brought in our scooters for P.E. We worked on control our scooters around cones and not bumping into the signs! To help remember 'a', we d a fun African Animal yoga story. The children showed great strength and flexibility. For 't' we painted tigers and read 'The Tiger who came to Tea, and 'p' was lots of painting, playdough, pencils and pink and purple paper! In Maths we have been meeting Numberblocks 6-10. Getting up to 10 meant we could sing lots of songs- 10 naughty monkeys, 10 green bottles and 10 in the bed.	
Class 1	This week in phonics Year 1 have re-capped segmenting and blending phase 4 words and tricky words. In literacy we have continued our work on Beegu and have started planning and designing a lost poster about her. In maths we have started comparing numbers and using the vocabulary of "greater than, "less than" and "equal to". In science we went on a lovely autumnal walk around the school and spotted lots of signs of autumn. In PSHE we have written out goals that we would like to achieve in Year 1.	
Class 2	This week in Class 2, we took advantage of the late summer weather and walked to Parliament Hill to sketch the Lon- don skyline. The children followed a route that we had planned in advance as part of our Geography topic and drew some wonderful pictures, which we will use as a base for further artwork next week. In Science, we have been testing out ways to waterproof materials. The children devised an experiment using wax crayons, which we tested vigorously! In literacy, we have begun to write an information text all about the Great Fire of London. We are looking forward to our trip to the Tower of London on Thursday to explore this topic further. Don't forget, Magical Maths Mornings will continue On Tuesday at 9am.	
Class 3	In Class 3 this week, we composed our own letters based on our text, 'The Day the Crayons Quit,' focusing on ex- pressing emotion effectively through writing. Our grammar this week involved recognising prepositions of time, place and cause. We also looked at expressing emotions and responding to them, as a great start to our mental health PSHE topic. Our maths Place Value unit moved on to reading number lines to 1000, which included counting intervals (jumps) on the lines so that we could label them correctly and solve missing number problems. In art, we used pan watercolours to mix brand new colours and gave them imaginative, descriptive names. In our geography lesson, a super challenge this week: we used atlases to help us locate up to 47 European countries on a blank map of Europe. Congratulations to all who took part in the Cross Country event, expertly organised by Pete. Those who stayed at school created some beautiful artwork inspired by author and Black Rights Advocate, Maya Angelou.	
Class 4	Year 4 have had another busy week. In Literacy, we are writing our own versions of Robin Hood. We have broken the story up into 5 parts: introduction, build up, problem, solution and ending. We are using writing frames to ensure we correctly punctuate our work and include our newly learnt literary techniques: simile openers and fronted adverbials. In Maths, we are able to compare and order 4 digit numbers. We are able to show 4 digit numbers, using a wide range of representations: words, place value charts, dienes, place value counters and partitioning. In Science, we learnt about the effects of cooling and heating. We learnt the different temperatures that this happens for different materials. On Friday morning, a large group of us were brave enough to take on cross country on the Heath. Well done Year 4!	
Class 5	This week, Class 5 has learned in Maths Roman Numerals and how to round to the nearest 10, 100, 1,000, 10,000 and 100,000. In English, we looked at the features of letters and wrote a persuasive letter to convince Evangelia to give us a longer break-time. In Science, Class 5 learned how mammals reproduce and in PSHE we discussed the energy different types and portions of food provide. In History, we looked at the difference between Athens and Sparta - the two most important city states in Ancient Greece - while also learning about The Battle of Marathon.	
Class 6	A busy week for creative writing in year 6: we refined our WW2 Blitz poetry (which is now on display in class) and also we completed the final versions of our Evacuee letters. In maths, we review negative numbers and moved onto reviewing addition and subtraction methods as well as factors. On Wednesday, the children visited the CLC and using Logic Pro music software, created their own 'jazz-funk' compositions: a link was sent on Dojo earlier in the week. We talked about the concept of a healthy lifestyle in PSHE and 'excavated our fossils' on Thursday in a rather fun lesson outside. On Friday, some participated in the annual Camden cross country run and others had a fun day of artistic




