The FSA can now accept monthly contributions via Apply Pay, Google Pay, and Any card. This is an alternative for the forms and the direct debit, so parents have more choice.








This week in class

Nursery

This week the children have shared their family photos. We've drawn a picture of the people in our family and they're on display in our role play area. We read 'party of the party' and talked about everyone having a different family, some of us have two dads or two mums and some of us have one mum or one dad. We used the loose parts to make faces and focused on shape recognition: circle, square and triangle. We've read some wonderful books to celebrate diversity and black history month. Books such as 'The colour of us', 'Ruby's worry', 'All are welcome' and 'The Mega magic hair swap'. We introduced a hair dresser role play, which has been very popular! The children have taken on the role of hairdresser/stylist and receptionist. Lots of fun! Next week, we'll explore all things Autumn (after a mini heat wave!).

Reception

This week Reception have been learning the new sounds 'i, n, m, d'. Learning 'i' meant we could go on an insect hunt in the Jungle Area and the garden. Now we know more letters we have been starting to blend some together to read simple words (e.g. sat, dip, man). This week we took home sharing books to read with our parents, please enjoy them at home and then remember to bring them back on Thursday. We were writing our names this week. Every morning we have to read our name to sign in, and we are now making sure we can also write our name, or at least make sure we know the order the letters go in. In Maths we have been sorting. We have been sorting by texture, colour, size and even making our own categories. We then used this knowledge to try and spot odd ones out. This week we have also been singing the days of the week and months of the year song to help with our daily calendar. We like counting down to the exciting things happening this month.

Class 1

This week in phonics we have started growing the code and looking at the phase 5 graphemes 'ay', 'ou', 'oy' and 'ea'. The children have done some amazing writing in phonics this week and we are so proud of them. In maths we have looked at ordering objects and numbers and using the number line. We have also created a maths challenge station to challenge ourselves at the mathematical concepts that we have covered so far. In topic we have written labels for our mini museum at the back of our classroom. Well done for another great week Year 1.

Class 2

We had our third 'Magical Maths Morning' of the year in Class 2 this week, where the children taught the grown ups the importance of subitising (recognising groups of numbers quickly) through playing 'Fishy 7's' Next Tuesday we will be learning how to play 'Swappy Strips' I hope you can make it from 9-9.15 in Class 2. Class 2 continued to write their information reports about The Great Fire of London, adding a section entitled 'How the Fire Spread.' In maths, we have been focusing on 'greater than/less than' and the associated symbols. It's important for Class 2 to remember that Crocodiles always want to eat the biggest, juiciest snack! In geography this week, we have been placing important landmarks on an outline map of London. We got to see some of these landmarks in real life and up-close when we went on a fun and very informative trip to the Tower of London yesterday.

Class 3

This week, Class 3 began their new maths topic, addition and subtraction. We recapped addition and subtraction number bonds to 10, and applied our knowledge to larger numbers: for example, when we know that 9-6=3, we also can calculate that 90-60=30 and 900-600=300. Now we know why those bonds to 10 are so important to us! In literacy, we read a non-fiction book all about Captain Scott's amazing but Ill-fated journey to the South Pole in 1912. We learnt dictionary skills to help us make a glossary of technical and topic-related words for the book. Did you know that you can take a tour inside Scott's preserved Antarctic hut on Google Earth? We combined geography and art this week to make observational sketch studies of famous European landmarks. In gymnastics, we practised essential moves on mats – forward and backward rolls, cartwheels, and jumps into rolls. In science, we explored which animals are carnivores, omnivores or herbivores and sorted them in a Venn diagram.

Class 4

Year 4 have worked hard this week. In Maths, we have learnt how to round to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000, using our rounding rhyme: "five to nine climb the vine, zero to four slide to the floor!" This helps us to know whether to round up or down. In Literacy, we have finished writing our Robin Hood story. This was guided and we used writing frames for each paragraphs. After this, we planned our own imaginative stories about Robin Hood. We look forward to writing these next week. In Art, we have started our bright, colourful headdresses as we transform ourselves into pharaohs. These will be displayed in the classroom. In PSHE, we have learnt about some of the dangers of alcohol.

Class 5

This week, Class 5 has learned in Maths how to add and subtract numbers with more than 4 digits. In English, we learned about the features of biographies and also researched information and wrote biographies on important black people as part of Black History Month. In Science, Class 5 learned about Jane Goodall and her work with chimpanzees and in History we discussed about the Olympic Games and compared the events in Ancient Greece with modern ones. Lastly, in PSHE, Class 5 spoke about the nutritional information that food labels provide.

Class 6

This week in class 6, children learned about both the physical and behavioural adaptations of a range of animals that have allowed them to adapt and survive to the 5 major habitats across the Earth. Did you know that a camel has double eyelashes and the ability to pinch its nose shut so that it is protected during sandstorms? Fascinating stuff eh? We also continued our historical work on W.W. 2 by looking at how rationing of both food (and later and clothes) was introduced in January of 1940. Children also made their own rather delicious corned-beef hash browns to see what cooking with limited food resources was like: a huge thanks to Dawn for working with the children in the Lab. In Literacy, we planned and write our story all about being 'Behind Enemy Lines' and in Maths, we reviewed common multiples, prime numbers to 100 and squared and cubed numbers. Next Tuesday is our visit to the Zoo!


