
## Science Week in EYFS



### Science Week in 41 to 46



This week in class		
Nursery	It's been a Spooktacular week in Nursery. This week we combined Halloween and science activities. On Monday we made a bouncy egg for our first ever eggsperiment! It was eggcellent! The children have thoroughly enjoyed playing in the 'haunted house' and we've read many 'Winnie the witch' stories this week. We've also made witch potions, carved pumpkins and explored ice melting through spooky frozen Halloween hands! Our best experiment was of course, chocolate crispy cakes! We talked about the changed of solid to liquid form and used language such as melting. The Planetarium was a highlight of the week. We travelled into space and saw Planet Earth and the moon, as well as learning about gravity. Don't forget to	
Recep- tion	Reception have enjoyed Science Week as it linked well with us celebrating Halloween. We learnt about the bones and the skeleton reading Funnybones, we made a bubbling witches potion, and we learnt how to cook Halloween shaped pasta. The children were great at using scientific language to ask questions and explain what is happening. We used words like 'boil', 'mixing', 'changing', and 'magnetic'. We also enjoyed seeing space in the planetarium and making slime in the lab. In phonics we have been learning the phonemes 'h', 'b', 'f' and 'l', and our new tricky word is 'the'. In maths we have been learning to subitise. This means knowing a number without counting. The children love shouting out the right number. Finally we excit-	
Class 1	This week in phonics we have continued learning new phase 5 graphemes and have started learning phase 5 tricky words. The children have been working so hard during their phonics lessons and have really challenged themselves with their sentence writing. In maths we have looked at addition fact families. We've done practicial activities using the bar model and partwhole model and have also started learning a number bonds to 10 song. As this week was science week we have carried out a variety of activities based around our 5 senses and everyday materials and their properties. We had a materials hunt around the school, sorted the objects according to their materials and described the properties of each material. We've played plenty of games and also took part in lots of fun workshops with visitors throughout the week. Well done for a great first week back class 1!	
Class 2	Science week has passed by in a flash! We were lucky enough to have a visit from Caroline, a scientist from the Francis Crick Institute, who taught us about the 'Journey of a Germ.' She also brought in some natty little microscopes so that we could examine what our skin looks like close-up and other objects in our classroom. Later the same day, we ventured inside a planetarium to watch a movie about a dog going into space. Today, we have been making slime (sorry) and learning about chemical processes. We also squeezed in a design and technology session, which was led by Rob. He is helping us to design a new building for London. In literacy, we discovered more about a nurse named Mary Seacole, who has only recently been recognised for the important part she played in the Crimean War. In maths, we have been investigating how adding to 10 first helps to make addition easier.	
Class 3	What a fantastic Science Week we've had here in Class 3! We began the week by investigating how much 'hidden' sugar there is in our foods. Did you know that a small bottle of fizzy pop contains nearly 13 teaspoons of sugar? We predicted, measured out and recorded the results in a bar chart. We had a fascinating visit from a Crick Institute scientist and conducted a fair test to see if femur length affects how far someone can jump. We found that, surprisingly, it makes no difference, as other factors like practise, muscle strength and diet come into play. On Wednesday, we ventured on a journey to the Moon with Max the Dog in the mobile planetarium, and on Friday, we got messy and made slime. In our literacy lessons, we researched, made notes and created a fact file all about the scientist-inventor Lewis H. Latimer, who worked with Thomas Edison on the first light bulbs. In preparation for writing a biography at the end of this literacy unit, we read and compared two different biographies of the astronaut Mae Jemison, picking out the features of biographies such as subheadings and chronological order of events. Our maths continued as usual, extending our strategies for subtracting and crossing the 10 in	
Class 4	Its been a busy Science Week for Year 4. We have seen planets and stars in Planetariums. We have witnessed explosions and chemicals changing colours performed by scientist Dr Szydlo. We have set up investigations to test our hearing with the help of a scientist from the CRICK. We have even made slime in the Lab. In addition to this, in class, after learning the meanings of evaporation, condensation and precipitation, we discovered the scientist who discovered the wonders of the Water Cycle - Bernard Palissy. After creating our own Water Cycle wheel, we wrote a story based upon Drippy the Raindrop and his journey through from sea, to cloud, to rain, to river, back to sea again. We have also set up Water Cycles in a bag to test this phenomenon for ourselves.	
Class 5	Class 5 has had a lovely week celebrating Science Week! We conducted lovely fun experiments in school and at The Francis Crick Science Institute: testing the properties of different materials - such as plastic, rubber, cotton - making circuits with light bulbs and fans as well as conducting different tests - such as PH test, solubility test, magnetism - to tell apart different white powders (salt, sugar, corn flour, baking powder) we were given. In English, we also learned about expanded noun phrases and the features of suspense writing and we wrote our own suspense stories about a haunted house.	
Class 6	We started the week by travelling to The Salvation Army in Chalk Farm, where a dazzling array of talented people (from the Met Police to the drugs charity 'Hope'), regaled class 6 children with useful tips all about how to navigate London safely. We learned about fire safety, how to cope using London's varied transport systems and even what to do if a stranger asks you to deliver something - even only a few yards away. It has been Science week, so the children learned about Carl Linnaeus and how to classify living things into their genus and species - interesting stuff. We also studied all about plastic pollution and how our habits (as human beings) are endangering other creature on our planet. We started a new Literacy topic all about writing biographies and even had time to play a few, fun maths games too.
