| Nursery | This weeks focus has been measuring. We've used mathematical language such as, shortest/tallest/ longest/smallest/biggest. We've measured worms (the plastic kind), each other and we've used multi- link to make tall towers. We've been singing our weekly rhyme 'The grand old Duke of York' whilst marching around the playground. We swapped the home corner and construction area, the change has created new play opportunities, which has been wonderful to observe. Our number of the week is 2. We've found various ways of showing two using our fingers and we've been busy drawing the number two on post- it notes. We also enjoyed a sock matching activity. Next week we'll be celebrating Diwali. | |
| Recep- tion | We've all been very resilient this week as we got on with our learning as poor Emma was stuck at home feeling poorly. We have celebrated Diwali, opened an Indian restaurant, drew rangoli patterns and made Diwali cards. Our new tricky words- as and put. In maths we thought about MORE or LESS. | |
| Class 1 | We have been busy bees in Year 1 as we focus on our topic of TOYS! We looked at some toys and de- cided if their were old or modern. On Tuesday we were treated to a visit by Dr Matt Pritchard Science Magician. You can take a look at some of his online videos here. <u>https://www.youtube.com/shorts/IMLfkCtEeaQ</u> He uses scientific princi- ples to create illusions. | |
| Class 2 | In Class 2 this week we have been working out the 'bounciest ball,' subtracting using tens frames and number lines and putting the finishing touches to our buildings. Class 2 devised an experiment using an iPad, metre rule and three different types of ball. Their hypothesis was that the ping pong ball would bounce the highest, which wasn't always the case! They worked well in groups to collect data and present it on a graph. In maths, they have been using their number bonds to 10 to help solve subtraction sums. They have used tens frames, number lines and dienes to do so. We also started learning some of the songs for this year's nativity, entitled 'Baubles.' Lyrics and scripts will be coming home next week and homework for the next couple of weeks will be to learn these. Thank you in advance. | |
| Class 3 | This week, Class 3 have continued addition and subtraction, moving on to the column method adding 2- and 3- digit numbers. We also began practising the 3 times table. In literacy, we learned how to take notes while watching information videos, discovering that we only need to write short key words and facts, not whole sentences, to jog our memories when we'll need to use those notes later to write a full biography. We also looked at regular and irregular forms of the simple past tense. On Friday, we had a wonderful trip to The Place in Euston, giving us a rare opportunity to watch dance classes led by amaz- ing professionals, in preparation for our dance course in school at the start of the Summer Term. | |
| Class 4 | Year 4 have had a brilliant week! In Literacy, as part of our poetry unit, we learnt the differences be- tween haikus and tankas. In groups, we planned and wrote tankas based around nature. We created giant posters displaying our tankas and recited them to the class. In history, we have learnt about An- cient Egyptian religious beliefs. We created fact files for our favourite gods or goddesses. In Art, we de- signed canopic jars. We used a variety of animal designs to create intricate heads which we carefully moulded them using clay. Next week we will paint them! | |
| Class 5 | This week, Class 5 has been researching information about Victorian England as we'll start reading A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens next week. We have learned about Victorian people, the divide between the rich and poor, workhouses and the many innovations and advancements of that era. We also conducted an investigation in Science to test which material is the best thermal insulator to keep our food hot in our lunch bags. Class 5 learned about prime numbers and went over what we already knew about multiples and factors. We also really enjoyed our visit to The Place where we got to watch dance classes. | |
| Class 6 | Children have been immersed in the world of micro-organisms this week - which is handy as it is cur- rently 'Anti-Microbial Resistance Month'. We compared the similarities and differences between the structure of bacteria, viruses and fungi - and the children began to research a very important man: Ed- ward Jenner. In Literacy, we have fine-tuned how to write a biography, including the use of an effective introduction and opening 'main-body' paragraph. The children also researched a famous personality, making notes on the important facts and dates that has characterised their lives. In maths, we finished off our topic by looking at the order of operations and mental calculations. As if that wasn't enough, we have also been preparing our Assembly all about WW2. | |
