

Stay safe Programme .This is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. This programme reiterates the messages from Anti-bullying week that children should speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.



This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed. #### This week in class Nursery "We're going on a bear hunt, we're going to catch a big one...." Can you guess our book focus? This week we went on a bear hunt through long wavy grass, a deep cold river, thick oozy mud, a deep dark forest and a cave! It was so much fun. We're going on a bear hunt is one of our Fitzjohn's fabulous favourites, don't forget you can borrow it from our book corner! We sequenced events from the book on our story map, we used wool for grass, tissue paper, match sticks and cotton wool. We've been re-telling the story using our new story-sack puppets. Our phoneme this week is 'i'. Igloo was a new word for us and we watched a short clip about how igloos are made. The children initially thought bears lived in igloos. We've also explored 5, our number of the week. We've used number 5 Numicon in the playdough, as well as singing songs such as 5 current buns and 5 little speckled frogs. We ended the week with some cooking fun. On Thursday the children grated potato and made a potato pie and on Friday we made biscuits. We even saw a sprinkle of snow! Recep-In Reception this week we have been continuing to enjoy the Naughty Bus story. We painted our woodwork buses, and thought tion where our Naughty Buses might go. We recorded our ideas on a story map. This week our sounds have been 'z', 'zz', 'qu' and 'ch'. We love learning the phrases for each digraph- "quick its the queen" and "chew the cherries children". Another four new tricky words this week- no, go, to and into. We are starting to learn how to write them too! We enjoyed doing some cooking this week- we made some pizzas, and had a go at grating our own cheese. Super for our finger and hand strength. This week in maths we have been counting forwards and backwards to 5. Class 1 This week in literacy we have done some work based around the story 'Lost in the Toy Museum'. As a whole class we discussed and sequenced the story and then the children retold the story by writing some fantastic sentences. The children were all given individual writing targets to work on and produced some beautiful work. In maths we looked at parts of a part-whole model, number bonds and writing subtractions number sentences. In phonics we re-capped all previously learnt graphemes and tricky words. The children love to challenge themselves in phonics and enjoy playing the various games in class. In music we have been practising our nativity songs and in D&T we have made a start on constructing our moving vehicles. Well done for another great week Year 1. Class 2 Another busy week has zoomed by in Class 2, where we put our knowledge of expanded noun phrases into practise, writing character descriptions for our own 'dinner lady' from Roald Dahl's 'Matilda.' The children have been highly creative in their use of adjectives and we are encouraging them to use just the right number (no more that two per noun for now!) in their writing from now on. In maths, we have been practising using the column method to add two 2-digit numbers, carrying the ten if needs be. In science, we tested the 'stretchiness' of materials and hypothesised that one of our chosen materials might be more suitable for Janie's new PE kit than another. The children then devised an experiment where they measured three different materials in order to prove their assumption. We are now steaming ahead with nativity practise, so please make sure your child(ren) keep practising their lines and songs over the weekend. Help them to know their 'cue' by reading the lines before and after theirs also. Thank you . Class 3 This week, Class 3 had an exciting computing trip to the Camden Learning Centre, where we followed detailed instructions to help us build moving Lego models using axles, gears, pulleys, motors and sensors. We learnt how to program the models to move and make sounds when they detected a movement nearby. Thank you to the parents who accompanied us. In maths, we began our new topic, Multiplication and Division, focusing on understanding times tables as being a set of equal groups, which can also be set out in straight rows and columns called an 'array.' In literacy, we found many words beginning with the prefixes sub- and super-, in addition to beginning our legends writing unit, focusing on St. George and the Dragon. We discovered that many countries have St. George as their patron saint. Did you know that the real George was a Roman soldier who never actually visited England? Our science investigation into light continued, and we tested various materials for their reflective properties, grading them in order, after which we put our knowledge to great use by designing Fitzjohn's book bags which would be highly visible when walking home in these dark winter evenings. Class 4 Year 4 have worked hard this week. In Literacy, we have written up our persuasive letters to Rob, asking him to allow a school trip to Egypt. On Thursday, each child received a letter personally from Rob. There was much excitement and suspense. Unfortunately, in his letter, Rob explained he had no choice but to refuse our request. Nevertheless, we reflected on our learning and successes meeting our objectives. In Maths, we have moved away from our work on Area and started on new topic on Multiplication and Division. Year 4 are now able to solve word problems involving multiplication and division facts for the 6 times table. In PSHE, we learnt the importance of washing our hands. We have designed informative, colourful posters, showing the steps involved to thoroughly wash your hands. Some of these will be displayed in the bathrooms. Class 5 This week, Class 5 has been learning in Maths how to convert improper fractions into mixed numbers and vice versa as well as comparing fractions with the same and different denominators. In English, we have been focusing on direct and indirect/reported speech, creating our own dialogue between characters from A Christmas Carol. In Science, we tested different materials to find out if they were electrical insulators or conductors and in PSHE we learned about the signs of mild and severe head injuries and what to do in case of a medical emergency. Class 5 also learned about the physical and human features of Geography and researched information about the human geographical features of an area in the UK. Lastly, Class 5 has been enjoying rehearsing for our Class Assembly! Class 6 After commencing the week with a rather lovely trip to the Magic Circle on Monday, year 6 managed to create their very first spreadsheet using Numbers on the iPad. Next, we will see whether we can analyse and manipulate data. In Literacy, we studied all about Rudyard Kipling and his distinctive, narrative style - including how to create tension. We reviewed improper fractions and adding / subtracting mixed numbers in Maths. Our topic work saw us delve into the short but significant life of Anne Frank and in Science, we considered the importance of decomposition and began to hypothesise about the conditions that micro-organisms thrive in. Finally, in R.E. we began our topic centred around the concept of Prophecy: children learned about both religious and secular views of this idea and looked at a diverse range of people including Nostradamus and Moses.
