

Nursery	
Recep- tion	A great and fun week in Reception this week. We have a post office in our classroom, so that we can write letters and cards to all our friends. We particularly enjoyed writing letters to Santa with lots of children had a go writing independently. We learnt our final sound of the term, the digraph 'nk' as in think and pink. We also learnt the tricky words 'of', 'push', 'me' and 'be'. We had a lovely trip to the Little Angel theatre on Thursday, we loved Charlie Cook and all the different characters he read about. Recently there has been some mischief with our numberline, with some numbers missing or in the wrong place. We found the culprit, a Christmas elf. As a class we decided on his name, and planned how we are going to look after him next week.
Class 1	This week in maths the children did some maths and reading quizzes in class. Everyone tried their best and scored really well. In literacy the children finished writing their own version of 'Lost in the Toy Museum'. They drew some lovely pictures and took great care with their handwriting presentation. In topic the children competed in teams and took part in a topic quiz all about toys. In art the children created and decorated teddys out of socks and various materials. In D&T they have started accessorising their moving vehicles. On Wednesday we went to Bloomsbury theatre to watch 'Finding Santa'. They were a credit to our school and their behaviour was exemplary. On Tuesday they also performed in the Nativity show. They looked cute, sang their little hearts out and made us all so proud. Well done for a great week Year 1!
Class 2	Class 2 did us all proud this week in their nativity production of 'Baubles.' It was a testa- ment to their hard work and resilience that they sung, spoke and acted so brilliantly. Well done! It has been a busy week, with a trip to the Bloomsbury Theatre to watch 'Finding Santa' and a visit from the big man himself on Friday. We have tried to keep some sem- blance of normality in all the excitement and have been practising column addition and subtraction (with regrouping) along with some descriptive writing. Homework this week is to complete Rob's book banner challenge (which can be done over the Christmas holi- days) and to learn their poem verse ready for our school poetry recital on Tuesday morning.
Class 3	This week in literacy, Class 3 have planned and written the legend of St. George and the Dragon, focusing on using wonderful and exciting descriptive language. In maths, we moved on to multiplying by 4, using arrays and groups. We also tackled some tricky logical thinking problems, working with partners in our maths investigations. In science, we explored shadows and how shadow length changes. As a treat on Friday, we met a special Christmas visitor as he stopped at Fitzjohn's on his journey from Lapland!
Class 4	What a week for Year 4. In Literacy we have been studying the features of non- chronological reports. Next week we will write our own based on our Science topic States of Matter. In Maths, we are developing our understanding of the 7 and 12 times tables. In RE, we have learnt the significance of the puja dish for Hindu rituals. In addi- tion to this, we have been busy with assessments for reading and maths and also start- ed decorating our lovely classroom. Some of our learning was on zoom this week and we felt like we had transported back to 2020!
Class 5	This week, Class 5 has been learning in Maths how to add fractions with a total greater than 1, add fractions and mixed numbers to other mixed numbers as well as subtract fractions with different denominators. In English, we have continued reading A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens, analysing the language and events of the plot. In Science, Class 5 investigated how different mixtures can be separated through different processes, such as sieving, filtration, magnetic attraction and evaporation. In PSHE, we learned how to place an unresponsive casualty in the recovery position until an ambulance arrives, while in Geography we discussed the different types of land use.
Class 6	A busy week of fractions, father xmas visits and big writes in year 6. In Science, we con- tinued our theme of kitchen hygiene by exploring the poor conditions in a 'local', kebab restaurant and writing to the owners to explain how to rectify them. We concluded our topic of racism and stereotyping in PSHE by examining our responses to stereotypes and in our topic lesson, children prepared speeches about key turning events during WW2.


