Nursery	This week has been all things Christmassy! We made salt dough decorations ,as well as Christmas biscuits. We enjoyed a post office role play in class, we've been busy wrapping parcels and posting letters. On Tuesday morning we performed a poem in our poetry school assembly, we were so proud of the children. Nursery enjoyed singing songs with Reception at the Festive sing-a-long, thank you for coming to watch! Have a wonderful break (illness free! Fingers firmly crossed!)
Recep- tion	Reception have had a very festive week! We enjoyed having a little Christmas grotto in our classroom, to wrap presents, and write gift tags. We made and wrote reindeer Christmas cards, and went on a fun yoga Christmas adventure to the North Pole. The children did great singing in our Festive sing-a-long, and enjoyed eating Christmas Lunch. Well done for a great first time, have lovely restful holidays, and see you in the New Year.
Class 1	This week in phonics we have been reviewing all of our phase 5 graphemes and tricky words. In maths we have done a maths quiz and recapped all of our learning over the past half term. In Art we have done lots of Christmas craft and created a cards, photo frames and tree decorations. On Wednesday afternoon we thoroughly enjoyed Rob's magic show and our lovely Christmas party. On Thursday Year 1 sang beautifully and did us proud in the KS1 concert. Well done for a fantastic term Year 1! Have a lovely break and we will see you in the New Year!
Class 2	In Class 2 this week, we have been tying up all our loose ends ready for a well-deserved Christmas break. The children have completed their maths unit on addition and subtraction. Please try and keep counting in 2s, 5s and 10s over the holidays and perhaps play a maths (or board) game. In literacy, we have been using expanded noun phrases to describe a yeti and imagining how it might feel to be confronted by one in the street. We enjoyed a rather wet trip to Keats Library on Tuesday and the children now have a couple of good reads for the holidays. Have a wonderful break and here's to a happy new year!
Class 3	What a fantastic final week of term we've had in Class 3! In our maths lessons, we had a week of solving logic problems and thinking 'outside the box,' including solving the tricky ancient Crossing the River puzzle and tackling a Christmas tree full of hidden triangles of all sizes. In literacy, we took on the challenge of festive anagrams, as well as rehearsing and performing 'Gran, Can You Rap' as part of the whole school poetry recital event. In our Design & Technology lesson, as part of the sewing progression curriculum, we made stuffed felt tree decorations and learned how to use a needle threader to help our sewing go more smoothly. Thank you to all the parents who contributed and helped with the wonderful party on Wednesday. Have a happy winter break, from all the Year 3 staff!
Class 4	Year 4 have had a fun festive week. We have spent time getting creative and decorating the classroom with paper chains, 3D and 2D snowflakes, Christmas trees, pictures and even a poem! We have also made beautiful, bright, sparkly cards. We have managed to fit in some Maths, where we learnt the 12 times table and solved word problems using our knowledge. In Literacy, we wrote our non-chronological reports on States of Matter and shared them with the class. Well done for all your wonderful hard work this term. Class 5	Class 5 has had a fun last week before the winter holidays! We finished reading A Christmas Carol by Charles Dickens, analysing the last few chapters and Scrooge's change. We also learned in Maths how to subtract fractions and mixed numbers, while in Science we learned about reversible and irreversible chemical reactions. In Geography, Class 5 discussed different changes in land use over time in England and the purpose of this. We also made our own winter decorations that we put up in our classroom and enjoyed watching the film A Christmas Carol and having a party on Wednesday!
Class 6	After a tremendously interesting visit to the Churchill War Rooms on Monday, Class 6 learned a new Maths game on Tuesday called 'Stockmarket'. As the name implies, it is based on the idea of buying and selling commodities (in our case shapes!) with the golden rule being 'buy low - sell high' - ask your child about it! On Wednesday, we had an interesting Science Quiz followed by a maths investigation all about investigating number patterns. In the afternoon, we were treated to food, music and dancing in our Xmas party: a huge thank-you to all parents involved in decorating the classroom and helping with food. 

The Governing Body (GB) met twice last term: once in October and, more recently, on 12th December.

The focus of October's meeting was to receive an update from Rob on the school reopening in September and GB noted that the year groups had settled in and there were no concerns to date. Rob also reported that the new office and premises staff team had settled in well.

GB discussed the summer term data for the children in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2, including the 2023 SATs results for reading, writing and maths. Whilst attainment was lower than targeted (and compared to previous years), it was noted that progress was good.

School Improvement Priorities 2023-24

Whilst operational matters are a major priority for Rob and his team, we, as a Board, also have a strategic responsibility and in October we confirmed the school improvement priorities for 2023/24, which align with the new Ofsted Inspection framework and are as follows:

- **Priority 1**: Increasing the % of children making expected or better progress in writing based on prior attainment, with a particular focus on disadvantaged children and low prior attainers.
- **Priority 2**: Improve attainment and progress in Science by improving teaching and learning of "working scientifically" area of Programme of Studies (PoS).
- **Priority 3**: Improve attainment and progress in Design and Technology by reviewing, adapting and improving the Design and Technology PoS.
- **Priority 4**: Improve attainment and progress in Geography by reviewing, adapting and improving the Geography PoS.
- **Priority 5**: Improve leadership and management by developing the role of (interim) phase leaders and improving their impact on teaching and learning and curriculum development.
- **Priority 6**: Further improve EYFS, increasing levels of literacy and ICT skills.
- **Priority 7**: Attendance of all pupils (especially those below 90%) improves during the academic year 2023-2024.
- **Priority 8**: Governance: All governors have an improved understanding of teaching and learning across the school. Governors have an improved understanding of the benefits (and otherwise) or partnership working/federations etc.

These will be the subject of a half-yearly review by Governors in March 2024.

I was proud to be re-elected the Chair of the GB and Danielle agreed to continue to be Vice Chair.

Rob encouraged governors to attend the Fitzjohn's conversation event on 17th January and the title will be "What is the purpose of Education?" Fitzjohn's Conversation is a great event (which hasn't happened since Covid) where the school community is engaged in a fun conversation about topics that impact the children's education. During the evening, parents, staff, children and governors get to sit together and brainstorm issues. It is a special opportunity to examine a topic from all these various angles, especially that of the children, who are incredibly articulate and get to take part in this grown up discussion. For example, distilling the school values which all of you probably know by now, was a result of a Fitzjohn's Conversation. Nibbles and drinks are provided.

In December, the main focus of our meeting was School Partnership Working and we received a very informative presentation from Stephen Hall, the CEO of Camden Learning. Partnerships can take many forms, such as sharing staff meetings when we have visiting speakers or working together to share learning ideas. We will discuss next steps at our February meeting.

GB also received the annual report on safeguarding at the school, as well as the updated Child Protection policy.

We also received the half-termly report from Rob, with key updates highlighted.

Another key task of governors in the autumn term is to review the performance of the Headteacher. We're supported in this by a representative from Camden. Together with their input, we have now set objectives for the coming year, and will be reviewing progress against the 23-24 objectives at our March meeting.

Our clerk, Mike Herlihy, always keeps us well informed about national developments in school governance as well as feedback from Camden. With his help, we have reviewed our training priorities for 2024 and allowed us to reflect on key governor contributions (see below) to our wonderful school in the last school year.

School Governors

Listed below are some examples of governor contributions to the school in the 22-23 school year:

"Bringing a fresh parent governor perspective."

"Bringing governor training insights to the GB meetings, for example questions for governors to consider during governor's day at school."

"Attending a meeting regarding solar panels for the school, to make the school more self-sufficient, lower its environmental impact, and reduce energy costs and helping consider the solar panel project based on legal experience."

"I have been able to give insights into how the school is led and managed and been able to answer questions governors might have in meetings. As my area of focus in school is inclusion and SEN, I particularly provide information to the governing body on these areas."

"I feel I have contributed especially to the now flourishing music provision, and I would like to pursue this further and help bring visual arts up a little too."

"I have chaired a Committee, mentored a new governor. With two other governors, in autumn 2022 I carried out the Headteacher's annual performance review. I interviewed for a new member of the administrative staff."

"Attending assemblies."

"On behalf of the Governing Body, I have attended various meetings such as the Standards meeting, governor's induction meeting, challenge partners, job interviews, subject focus days and ongoing meetings with the Headteacher."

"I have connected with the school community by attending events, and through the governors' day at school."

"I have attended training sessions (Health and Safety and governor's role in the curriculum) with Camden, including the primary chair's forum. I have taken part in the Headteacher performance review and fulfilled the role of lead governor for Safeguarding."

"I have supported the school through its organisational change. I have tried to support and challenge the school and its management throughout the year and hope to continue doing so throughout next year. I am interested in thinking strategically about the issue of partnerships and supporting the school as it works on achieving its School Improvement Priorities and overall goals."

"To give 'a voice' to the staff in terms of the 'day-to-day' experiences when working at Fitzjohn's."

"To give an honest insight into all aspects of teaching and learning within the school."
