VACANCIES ON SCHOOL GOVERNING BODY

FITZJOHN'S PRIMARY SCHOOL IS LOOKING FOR 2 PARENTS/CARERS TO SERVE AS PARENT GOVERNORS ON THE GOVERNING BODY FROM APRIL 2024

The Governing Body announces that from the start of April there will be a vacancy on the School Governing Body for 2 Parent/Carer Governors as the terms of office of two existing Parent Governors (Christina Pappas Kohle and Nick Zangwill) are ending on 31st March 2024.

Nick has indicated he is willing to stand again, Christina is stepping down after completing two terms.

The GB plays a vital role in monitoring and evaluating the work of our school and helping to continuously raise standards. We meet twice a term in the evening for a couple of hours, additionally there are two committees that meet termly that Governors can volunteer to participate in. Dates are set well in advance, and expenses such as childcare are payable. Each governor also takes responsibility for one of the classes within the school, and a particular subject, and represents their interests to the GB.

Camden offer excellent Governor training and support. A full induction will be available, as well as a chance to shadow existing Governors to familiarize yourself with the role should you wish to do this.

The GB does not and is not expected to be involved in the day-to-day operational running of the school. Commitment, enthusiasm and a genuine interest in the development of the school and the children is really what motivates successful GBs and ours is no exception.

The term of office is up to 4 years, and the election is open to all parent/carers at the school.

	This week in class				
Nursery	Nursery have been looking at the paintings of Mondrian this week. Our number focus has been 9 and we have revised lots of difference letter sounds—ask us which ones we know. Have you read Everywhere Bear by Julia Donaldson? We have and we loved it. Have a great half term break.				
Recep- tion	Reception have been celebrating the Lunar New Year this week! We have been reading the Chinese folktale 'The Magic Paintbrush' in drawing club, and also the 'Two of Everything' story in maths. This introduced us to doubling (two of something). We have enjoyed learning about some of the customs that take place for the new year- we have made cards, made a dragon, a wishing tree, and cooked tasty treats in our Chinese restaurant. On Wednesday it was so lovely to have some of the parents in to help us with the celebrations. We also did some real cooking and learnt how to make Spring Rolls. We wrote the recipe and then made them. Most children thought they were really tasty! Our construction challenge on Friday was to make 'The Great Wall of China'. There was some great creativity and teamwork to make the most realistic and longest wall.				
Class 1	This week in literacy the children have been busy writing and illustrating their 'Mysterious Egg' stories. They also filled in a marking ladder so they know what to improve on next time in their writing. In maths we have been focusing on using number lines to 20 and understanding teen numbers. In science we focused on animal diets and discussed which animals are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. In PSHE we have created a Zones of regulation toolkit and written a list of resources we want to order to help us if we're ever feeling in the red, blue or yellow zone in school. In art we have created dinosaur fossils. Well done for a great half term Year 1 and have a lovely break.				
Class 2	Class 2 have had a busy week practising 'sharing' in maths (division) and their 2 x table. Please skip count in 2s over the holidays if you can. We have finished our 'whales' topic and our winding toys are on display in the KS1 corridor. In literacy, the children created fantastical creatures, similar to that which hatched out of the 'mermaid's purse' in The Waterhorse by Dick King-Smith. They wrote descriptive pieces about the creatures they created, including commas in a list and expanded noun phrases. We thoroughly enjoyed having parents in on Wednesday for our PSHE morning. Thank you to those who could make it. Have a lovely half term.				
Class 3	This week, we've been extremely busy in Class 3. As well as completing our maths unit on multiplication and division, we tackled some tough problems investigating and finding strategies to logically record combinations. How many dessert combinations could we make with four ice cream flavours and three different toppings? What if we added 5 main course choices too? In literacy, we got together to start writing our class assembly. We also sequenced the narrative of the Boudicca revolt against The Romans, and continued our class reader, 'I am Boudicca.' We had a fabulous art trip to The National Gallery, where we studied impressionist classics such as Monet's 'Waterlilies,' and a whole wall of Van Gogh pieces, as well as many more paintings! In science, we learned how fossils were formed and looked at some real fossils. Thank you to all the parents who visited our class to join in with our mindfulness and calming activities on Wednesday morning: breathe in, breathe out				
Class 4	Year 4 have had a brilliant week. In between practicing for our class assembly, watching Guys and Dolls at North Bridge House and demonstrating that we are Happy, Healthy, Safe children, in maths, we have been learning the formal written method for multiplication. In Literacy, we have finished our unit on The Iron Man. We wrote our own book reviews on Ted Hughes' text and rated it out of 5 stars. We then enjoyed planning our own Iron Man inspired story using the story mountain. We have written these, ensuring we use paragraphs, the past tense, exciting vocabulary and fronted adverbials. We have also finished our DT unit on sewing, all creating secure, practical archaeologist wallets.				
Class 5	This week, Class 5 learned in Maths about decimals with up to 2 decimal places and recognizing equivalent fractions and decimals. In English, we looked at the features of film reviews as well as planned and wrote our own film reviews. In Science, Class 5 learned about different types of mechanisms, such as gears, levers and pulleys. Lastly, we really enjoyed watching the French play at Edith Neville on Wednesday as well as filming our short silent movies!				
Class 6	Using a short story as their context, class 6 children worked in groups, pairs and finally individually to construct and rewrite their own narrative using story pegs together with sentence features like semi-colons to link and sequence and embedded clauses to add extra information. In Maths, we concluded our topic by looking at problems involving both ratio and proportion - including recipes. In R.E. we discussed justice by looking at stories from both Islam and the Christian faiths and on Friday, children narrated their 'Just So' big writes to children in year 2. Thank-you to all the wonderful cast and staff of North Bridge House, who put on an absolute corker of a musical on Wednesday when the class went to see their dress rehearsal of 'Guys and Dolls': it was truly magical! A big thank-you to all parents who came to our PSHE morning on Wednesday, where we were learning all about anxiety and how to cope using a variety of 'meditative' methods.
