#### Chair's Report

The Governing Body (GB) met twice last term: once in February and, more recently, on 20<sup>th</sup> March.

GB in February reflected on the key messages arising from the Fitzjohn's conversation evening in January particularly parental reference to the importance of play that assists communication and social interaction. GB also discussed the reference to the importance of critical thinking and reasoning and whether the school used this to its full extent. Governors believed that this is developed through the school's values and also exemplified at Fitzjohn's by children being encouraged to ask questions of their teacher.GB agreed how the summary report from Rob will inform the school's priorities going forward.

GB noted a very positive safeguarding review report produced by the Local Authority and that key data is reported via the Headteacher's half termly report to Governors .

In February we had a follow up session on Partnership and Federation Working referring back to the presentation at December GB by Steven Hall (Camden Learning) and the range of partnerships along a continuum ranging from a soft partnership to a hard federation. This initiative is being driven at both central and local government level . Our focus in February was on "soft federation working" and we noted the current range of partnership working . In terms of next steps Governors discussed potential benefits

like economies of scale and risks of further partnership working; the key points from the discussion and outcomes from the Fitzjohn's Conversation will inform an options paper to July GB following discussion with the staff in order that their views are included and this will also have regard to key outcomes from subject focus days. Rob identified the biggest risk for Fitzjohn's (of being part of a federation) would be losing what makes it different and special.

We also received the half-termly report from Rob with key updates highlighted at both our February and March meetings. In February we focused on updated data for each class and in March there was a discussion on pupil attendance which remains a concern for the school community. Rob has written to individuals and the whole school regarding this.

The GB in March considered a very positive report from the Challenge Partners who focused on what went well, as well as "even better if". It was a great experience which helps the school to know what it does well as well as what tweaks can be made to make it better.

The key focus of the March GB meeting was the six-month review of the Governing Body's 8 key priorities for the current year which I reported on in the FOCUS at the end of the Autumn Term. Rob provided assurance that we are broadly on track to meet the targets. Priority 6 relates to the Early Years Foundation stage (EYFS) and the GB last week received a very enlightening presentation from Class Teachers Laura Taylor (Nursery) and Emma Combes (Reception) on how assessment of the children's' progress is carried out in early years' including the use of Tapestry (the online learning journal) with examples of teacher and parental input. We received reports from Link Governor Danielle Litterick on her recent Subject Focus Visit on Geography (Priority 4) and on Music provision at the school by Link Governor Nick Zangwill.

This term I also reported back from the meeting of the Camden Primary School Chairs of Governors.

We placed on record our appreciation of the services of Christina Pappas Kohle who is standing down as a Governor at the end of March. Christina will, however, be remaining as an Associate Governor for a year in the first instance to sit on our Finance Committee as this is currently a skills gap on the Governing Body. We welcomed newly elected parent Governor, Tara Shannon who observed her first GB meeting .Thank you to all 5 candidates for putting themselves forward in the recent election.

Governor Training is an important part of our role and in March we received a report back on training attended by Governors Simon Lickert and Anya Smirnova on safeguarding and succession planning respectively.

Our clerk, Mike Herlihy, always keeps us well informed about national developments in school governance as well as feedback from Camden from termly governance network meetings and he keeps under review any action points.

GB also received its update on the school budget and plans to tackle the projected deficit and the detail will be considered shortly by the Finance Committee as they draw up the 24-25 budget. Again we face a growing deficit budget so, now more than ever, remain grateful to the FSA.

Ending another term the GB wishes all of you a very happy Easter, and a restful and joyful break.

Nursery	This week Nursery have celebrated Easter by making cards, reading stories, as well as making Easter chocolate nests. We had a visit to the quiet garden to see the frog spawn and tadpoles in preparation for our minibeast topic next term. We had so much fun showing our Easter hats to our friends and to the whole school during the parade. We watched the Reception class spring show 'The Gruffalo', well done all, it was fantastic! Nursery thoroughly enjoyed watching. Have a wonderful break!
Recep- tion	Reception were fantastic in their Gruffalo show. Great singing, dancing and acting! They had worked so hard learning it all! We had a fantastic post-show party with impressive Gruffalo food- cupcakes, cakes, knobbly knees, poisonous warts, purple prickle pancakes to name a few We also made our own Gruffalo crumble. The Easter hat parade was fun, and gave us an excuse to learn a bit about France. We saw the Eiffel Tower and learnt how croissants were made. A great end to a super term. Have lovely well deserved breaks!
Class 1	This week in literacy and maths we have been doing various quizzes and activities to round up the term. The children have also been doing various pieces of writing in their free writing books and shared them with the class. They also wrote an information text about the explorer Neil Armstrong. In topic we have compared the explorers Neil Armstrong and Christopher Columbus and have discussed their similarities and differences. In art the children have painted some fantastic pictures of a NASA spacecraft and made compasses out of cardboard. In D&T we have also sewn and decorated treasure bags ready for our treasure hunt on the first week back. Well done for another briliant term Year 1 and we hope you have a great break!
Class 2	It's been a lovely week in Class 2. On Tuesday, we were invited to go to Wagamama in Hampstead to try out their first schools' visit. We were treated to a look around the kitchen, told about the ingredients that go into their food, before weighing the ingredients which would go into our bowls of noodles. The children came away with a goodle bag and (mostly) a full tummy. I'm proud of them for trying the food, even if they weren't 100% sure! It was a great way to round off our topic about Japan. In maths, we have been finishing off our mini unit about length and in literacy, we have learnt a little about Haiki. Have a wonderful break.
Class 3	This week in class 3, we enjoyed Roman day filled with different activities, from making roman necklaces using coloured pasta, to vibrant mosaics. We were delighted to have visits from some of the parents to discuss important religious events such as Ramadan, Purim and Holi. Fitzjohn's hat parade and Easter stalls finished off the week with great enjoyment, as the children had fun guessing the amount of lego pieces in the jar.
Class 4	Year 4 have had a busy week this week. On Monday, a large group of us who are members of choir, went to the Camden Music Festival. On Tuesday we had a fun day of Computing at the CLC, where we made iMovies, demonstrating our learning from our topic of "Around the World." We loved using the green screen! We have also been publishers this week, publishing our first newspaper article all about Marco Polo's discoveries. We will make this into a giant newspaper to go in the Year 4 Book Corner. In Maths, we have been learning to understand and identify equivalent fractions. We were able to solve reasoning problems using our knowledge. Wishing all of Year 4 a wonderful, restful break. Lots of reading and times tables please!
Class 5	This week, Class 5 has learned in Maths how to read two-way tables and timetables, while in Science we learned about the movements of the Moon and its different phases. In History, Class 5 learned about the food that Maya people used to eat, which was mainly maize and cacao. In RE, we discussed the difference between a selfless sacrifice and a selfish 'sacrifice' using role-play. Class 5 has had a lovely term and is very excited for Spring break!
Class 6	Our week started with a visit, tour and guided experiences around the Tower of London to conclude our topic on Crime and Punishment. The children also played an educational Maths game based on the principles of world stock markets - buy low, sell high - which saw the children rake on the profits for their respective businesses. In Science, we used our knowledge of electricity and circuits to construct an electronic quiz game. Congratulations to all the children for their wonderful stalls: the weather played its part and I have a feeling that lots of money was raised for our June trip to Whitby - stay tuned!
