This week in class

Nursery

We are so proud of the maturity displayed by Nursery after returning from the Easter break. We've settled straight back into routine and witnessed wonderful play. We started our new Minibeast topic by reading Superworm. In maths we made playdough worms and measured the longest and the shortest. We had lots of comparisons and mathematical language being used during play. In phonics we've explored the /w/ phoneme. Nursery have such good phonetic awareness and came up with so many extra words, such as witch, wand, wind, water, watermelon. Many of the children didn't know what a walrus looked like so we researched images and visited Greenland on Google Earth. We also read the Giant Artic Jelly fish and looked at the northern circle on GE. This week the children experienced woodwork for the first time. We talked about the importance of safety when using tools and that we must wear safety googles at all times. The children were incredibly sensible and loved making different creations with wood and other resources.

Recep-

Reception have been celebrating this week. First we learnt all about Eid. We read some stories and learnt some of the things Muslims do during Ramadan and then to celebrate Eid-al-Fitr. We looked at pictures of mosques and attempted to make some with the construction. We liked making Eid cards too. On Thursday we had Tanya, Dana and Sagi come in to talk to us about Pesach, and we shared some 'wine' and matzah. In maths this week we have been meeting the Numberblocks 11 and 12. We have been counting up to these numbers, find out which smaller numbers are in the numbers and say one more and one less. In phonics this week we wrote a sentence remembering to start with a capital, use finger spaces and end with a full stop.

Class 1

This week in literacy we have started looking at the story 'Katie in London'. We discussed the story and all of the familiar landmarks we spotted. In maths we have started learning about multiplication and counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. We have learnt some great number songs, played numerous games and used bead strings, 100 squares etc to help us count. In phonics we are recapping all of our phase 5 phonemes ready for our phonics screening test in June. Our new topic this half term is 'Hampstead'. We have looked at books and also discussed the author A.A. Milne who wrote Winnie the Pooh and was born in Hampstead. Well done for working hard during a super busy week Year 1!

Class 2

Welcome back. I hope you all had a good break. Class 2 have demonstrated great resilience (our value for this half term) this week, in getting back into the swing of school. We have started learning about the Stone Age, particularly Stone Age houses and clothing. Class 2 started designing their own Stone Age tunic, which they will sew and decorate soon. In Science, we are investigating whether soil is necessary to plant growth and have set up an investigation to test our hypothesis. We will continue to study plants this half term, with a trip to Kew Gardens on Wednesday 15th May. In maths, we are studying 'mass, capacity and temperature' and in literacy, we are writing information books about the Stone Age. Please remember that we will be going to Keats Library this coming Tuesday (23rd April) Please could children return any outstanding library books. Please also let me know if you are able to accompany us. Thank you.

Class 3

During maths this week, year 3 have enjoyed learning about Mass and Capacity. We started by learning how to read scales then measuring using grams and kilograms and finally, working out equivalent masses using both of these units of measure. In literacy, we have started our Legends topic and we have read the Anglo-Saxon Poem Beowulf. We discussed the different language and vocabulary used in the poem and clarified unfamiliar words. We learned how to use apostrophes for possession and were correcting sentences during this as well. In science, we started our Plants topic. We identified and labelled the parts of a flowering plant as well as made a folding leaflet to demonstrate our understanding of the jobs and functions each part does as well. Our new history topic is Anglo Saxons which we have enjoyed learning the history of and in particular, the reasons why they decided to come to Britain.

Class 4

It's been a full on first week back after the Easter break! Infact, what Easter break?! We have started our new topic of The Vikings, studying who they were, where they came from and when and why they invaded Britain. In Maths, we have finished our unit on Fractions by adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator and converting these into improper fractions. Extra practice on this at home would be beneficial. In Literacy, we learnt some famous Viking sagas and identified some of their features. We then started our Class Text "Arthur and the Golden Rope." We are learning to describe characters using showing not telling techniques. In DT, we played some fun games involving light bulbs and buzzers. We are planning our own electronic quiz to link into our Science topic on Electricity.

Class 5

This week, Class 5 has learned in Maths how to classify angles as acute, obtuse, reflex and right angles, estimate their degrees and use a protractor to accurately measure them. In Literacy, we started reading the graphic novel The Arrival by Shaun Tan, analysing the first two chapters and answering comprehension questions. In Geography, Class 5 used atlases to locate the countries and capital cities of North and South America, while in RE we looked into Rites of Passage and in PSHE we discussed the qualities of a good friend.

Class 6

After a restful break, year 6 got straight back in to their stride preparing for the upcoming SATs tests. We have been reviewing geometry including shape and angles as it remains a 'gappy' area of knowledge. We have also looked at calculating the area of triangles and the equivalence between fractions, decimals, and percentages. In Literacy, we concluded our topic on persuasion by penning a letter to an ancient King asking for clemency for a fictional friend who has been sentenced to a trial by ordeal. On Wednesday, we had a great return to the RAF Museum in Hendon to participate in a day all about Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.
